



SC&RA Hauling Job of the Year Competition

RULES AND REGULATIONS

The Hauling Job of the Year Competition is conducted by the Specialized Carriers & Rigging Association. It is designed to honor and give special recognition to members that perform outstanding achievements in moving and trucking jobs.

The following rules govern the Hauling Job of the Year Contest:

1. A member in good standing, upon their one-year anniversary, may enter the Hauling Job of the Year Competition if the job entry was awarded and completed after their one-year anniversary date.
2. The hauling job must have been completed during the calendar year immediately preceding this year's Association Annual Conference.
3. Companies presenting a job must have had care, custody and control of that job to be eligible for entry.
4. Members may submit only one (1) entry per category.
5. A fee of \$200 (U.S. dollars) is to accompany each entry.
6. Each entry must be submitted on the official entry form and signed by an officer of the company.
7. Contestants **must submit** in writing a description of the Job and fully answer the questions asked on the Entry Form. Only one packet of material is required.
8. Contestants **must submit** a minimum of three (3) photographs (5X7 or larger) to illustrate the job. Digital images must be 300 dpi with an image size of 5X7 or larger. Photographic prints (no inkjet or laser prints).
9. The official entry form **must indicate** all visual aid equipment required for the presentation.
10. Entries must be received at the Association's office **six (6) weeks** prior to the start of the Annual Conference. In the event too many entries are received for that year's contest, the date and time stamp of receipt at the Association will be the determining factor for selection of entries to be presented at the Annual Conference.
11. The competition will be conducted during SC&RA's Annual Conference with the winners announced during the Closing Night Recognition and Awards Dinner. A company representative must be present at this event.
12. Each contestant will be permitted a **maximum** time of **fifteen (15) minutes** for their presentation.
13. Entries will be judged only on the hauling portion of each job which may include incidental rigging, etc.
14. Only one winner from each category will be allowed.
15. There will be no less than three (3) Transportation Group members to judge the contest.
16. The **minimum score** a company must obtain in order to win the contest is **80 points**.
17. The maximum attainable score by a contestant is one hundred (100) points.
18. In scoring a contestant, the judge may assign any numerical score from zero (0) to the highest number possible for each criteria. There is no obligation to award the total possible points.
19. When there is a tie score, an additional ten (10) points will be awarded to the entry that, in the opinion of the judges, will have the most impact upon the membership and the general public.
20. Decisions of the judges will be final. All protests connected with the competition must be made in writing to the Association staff within fifteen (15) days after the contest.
21. As part of contest participation, winners are expected to present their jobs at the following Specialized Transportation Symposium.

ENTRY CATEGORIES

• Moving Job

Movement using specialized equipment, such as self-propelled transporters, dollies and crawler assemblies. Transport must be evident.

• Trucking Job (Less than 160,000 lbs net)

Movements using highway licensed tractors and trailers, predominantly via public highways (modifications to hauling unit are permitted).

• Trucking Job (160,000 - 500,000 lbs net)

Movements using highway licensed tractors and trailers, predominantly via public highways (modifications to hauling unit are permitted).

• Trucking Job (Greater than 500,000 lbs net)

Movements using highway licensed tractors and trailers, predominantly via public highways (modifications to hauling unit are permitted).

JUDGING CRITERIA

Shipment Routing (Possible points: 10)

Dimensions, Weight, Characteristics, Other

Planning the Job (Possible points: 20)

Man Hours Involved, Regulatory Approvals (permits, etc.), Other

Physical Elements (Possible points: 10)

Terrain, Weather, Shoring Present Facilities, Building New Facilities, Other

Safety Considerations (Possible points: 15)

Driver Supervision, Equipment Use, Precautionary Measures, Other

Execution (Possible points: 45)

Number of Man Hours Involved, Ingenuity, and Innovations.

Total Points = 100
